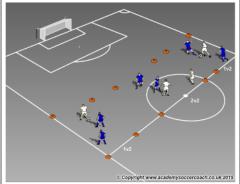

# **NOTES**

#### Activity 1

set up 10x15 yard grids; play 1 vs. 2 in each grid; after three rounds advance to 2 vs. 2. Coaching Points: body posture of the pressure (1st) defender Guided Discovery

Q.: What are the cues to go for the ball?

A.: Out of control dribbling or slow pace of a pass or sloppy receiving of a pass or pass or receiving into tight space or inaccurate pass or receiver 'blind' to oncoming pressure.

## Activity 2

3 Zone Game; players stay in their zone (3 in each end zone, 2 in the middle zone); switch 1 defender with 1 attacker every 2 minutes; attackers pass end zone to end zone, passes shoulder height at max; defenders try to intercept passes; focus on no gap between defenders to deny the penetrating pass; stay compact; pressure and cover; proper communication by the 2nd defender. tighter or looser (distance to 1st attacker), right or left (direction to jockey the 1st attacker), contain or tackle (action for the 1st defender to execute)

Coaching Points: distance and angle of support of the cover (2nd) defender Guided Discovery

Q.: How can you improve the odds for the defense?

A.: Force the dribbler onto his weak foot or jockey the dribbler away from support or away from good shooting angles or toward a boundary line.

### Activity 3

4 vs. 2 to small goal;  $30 \times 20$  yard grid;  $900 = 4' \times 6'$ 

Coaching Points: how do the pressure (1st) and cover (2nd) defenders switch roles - drop off & step up - V

Guided Discovery

Q.: Why should the cover (2nd) defender take charge?

A.: Being in a deeper position she has the best view of the pressure by the 1st defender, the ball, the opponents and space.

# Activity 4

6 vs. 6 match; 60 x 45 yards; age appropriate goals

Coaching Points: reinforce good pressure and cover. The details to coach if the players are ready proper angle to jockey in the defending third on the flanks or in the central channel Guided Discovery

Q.: Why should the cover (2nd) defender talk loud and often?

A.: To be sure the pressure (1st) defender hears and does the commands.
